Subject: Demand to Reopen Animal Cruelty Case Against Jayco Former Employees

We are Janelle Babington and Penny Eims, co-founders and petitioners with <u>Animal Victory</u>, reaching out on behalf of 17,785 petition signers demanding accountability in the tragic case involving Travis McKay, John Lipscomb, and Arlin Hochstetler.

Mold Three Men Who Killed Cats in Trash Compactor Accountable

## **Misrepresentation in Press Release**

Your recent press release titled "Additional Evidence and Indiana Law Exceptions Do Not Support Formal Criminal Charges Being Reinstated in Alleged Animal Abuse Case" asserts that:

- "Additional evidence ... and ... exceptions ... do not support formal criminal charges being reinstated" (elkhartcountyprosecutor.com).
- It claims that evidence showed no intent "to cause suffering or prolonged physical pain" and that the animals posed a threat or caused substantial property damage.

# Legal Standards Misapplied

Indiana Code § 35-46-3-12(c) categorizes torture or mutilation of a vertebrate animal as a Level 6 felony if done *knowingly or intentionally*. Omitting "intentionally" in your press release distorts the legal threshold and weakens the standard for prosecution.

Furthermore, IC § 35-46-3-5(a)(10)—referenced in your justification—permits destruction *only* if animals are *endangering*, *harassing*, *or threatening* livestock/domestic animals, or causing **substantial** property damage. No objective evidence has been presented that supports this statutory exception.

### **Clear Intent & Torturous Method**

- Your own release confirms the cats were **deliberately captured** and **knowingly placed** into a trash compactor.
- Trash compactors apply high-force crushing designed to destroy material. The use of such a machine on living animals constitutes clear **torture and mutilation**, as defined under Indiana law.

## **Dangerous Precedent**

This dismissal sets a troubling precedent for Elkhart County:

### What precedent does this set for a town you are hired to protect?

It sends a message that:

- Admitted acts of cruelty are permissible without consequence.
- Legal interpretations can be bent to protect offenders and corporate interests.
- Animal protection laws are vulnerable to misapplication, and public trust in the justice system is eroded.

#### **Our Demand**

We reject your office's legal interpretation and urge immediate corrective action. We respectfully demand:

- 1. **Reopening of all three criminal cases** against John Lipscomb, Travis McKay, and Arlin Hochstetler.
- 2. **A correction or clarification** to your June 2025 press release, explicitly including the statutory language omitted.
- 3. **Appropriate charges under IC § 35-46-3-12**, and consideration of violations under Elkhart County's Animal Ordinance.

## **Next Steps**

Our pursuit of justice will not be silenced. Absent immediate corrective action, we will continue to mobilize:

- National and local press
- Legal and legislative reviews
- Public demonstrations and protest
- Further organizational pressure

The lives of those cats matter—and so does the responsibility of your office to apply the law with integrity and consistency.
